






These tools are found on the editing palette.






NEW FEATURE

While <u>filters</u> have always been a feature in the Storyboard Creator, we made it a lot easier to add a little something extra to your creations!

The new **filter window** allows you to see exactly what the item will look like with each selected filter. You can double up on filters to add that extra level of customization. It works on everything: scenes, characters, items, and uploaded images!

Filters can help **convey mood and story**. Grayscale and Sepia give your storyboards an old-timey feel. The soft focus or diffuse filters can show memories or dreams. Blurring or silhouetting add elements of mystery.

To add a filter, select the item and **click the blue "filters" button** to bring up the preview window. When you're ready to go, click "Let's Go".
